Not only did I want to thank you for the recognition of those milestones, but I want to share my appreciation for the gift of the liturgical stoles that were a part of the celebration (at this writing I've already had a chance to use the green and purple stoles—white will get worn on Christmas). My family and I were most grateful for the celebration and the opportunity to reflect on the years that we have shared together as pastor and congregation.

Second, Sunday, January 8th, which is observed on the liturgical calendar as "The Baptism of Christ" will give us the opportunity for each of us to remember and celebrate our own baptisms. Baptism is one of those occasions which is done only once but can be remembered and affirmed a number of times in a lifetime. We will have the chance to not only remember our baptism but also to reflect on the promises that were made on our behalf and claimed by us later in life.

Third, Salem will be hosting a Community Service of Healing on Tuesday, January 24th at 7:00 p.m. The service, which will include participation from other area clergy, will feature worship, a moment of teaching, and opportunities to seek out healing prayer and the laying on of hands, if that is desired. We had services like this some time back, and a number of our local clergy felt it was time to bring back the practice.

Last, I want to acknowledge the group of individuals who helped to repair the siding on the east side of Fellowship Hall. Spearheaded by Jeff Bender of the Consistory's Property Committee, Jeff Greuel, Dick Groene, Andy Hartmann and Dale Miller became the work group that tackled the siding job--many thanks to all of you for a job well done.

That ends the laundry list.

May God bless all of you and all those who you love in the new year ahead.

As we greet the new year, we are in a great position to look back at all that we have accomplished over the past year. We have supported local ministries, as well as some far away, like Biloxi, Mississippi. Our congregation has been generous.

And of course there are new opportunities to consider this new year. Our friends at St. John's UCC in Sheboygan have spearheaded a mission, starting an overnight warming shelter in the downstairs of the Salvation Army, downtown Sheboygan.

The goal is to provide a place to get in out of the cold - 25 beds for area homeless people to rest. This is a mission that many area churches have committed to helping with, and Salem is welcome to participate. Volunteers are needed to help out during the overnight period.

The shelter is alcohol, drug and weapon free - each evening has two shifts - the first from 7:00 p.m. to 3 a.m. and the next from 3 a.m. to 8:30 a.m. Intake starts at 8:00 p.m. Adults staying at the shelter will get a warm bowl of soup before lights out at 10:00 p.m. In the morning there's a warm breakfast of oatmeal before they leave. Help is needed in getting the people settled and fed, and to assist as needed.

I don't know that there is a more meaningful way to share Christ's love in our local community. If you think you would be interested in helping, please let me know.

A reminder for post-holiday shopping - Fairview School is accepting boots, gloves, snow pants, sweatpants for children ages 5-10. Please keep them in mind as you take advantage of the shopping season.
