FIRST NOTES

FIRST NOTES

As we approach the start of a new year, I want to lift up an issue that will be discussed and voted upon at Salem's Annual Meeting (following the 8:30 a.m. worship service) on **Sunday, January 30th**. At the December Consistory meeting it was decided that the Consistory would recommend a discontinuation of the 10:30 a.m. service, pending congregational approval, and effective as of February 1st.

The reasons for such a move? 1) Attendance at the 10:30 a.m. service has dwindled to the 20-30 person range; 2) The scheduling of the late service cuts the available time for the Church School to teach a lesson in and then dismiss in time for the late service.

Unlike the 8:30 a.m. service (which still remains our best attended service) and the Saturday 4:30 p.m. service (which has experienced growth), the 10:30 a.m. service has shown a steep decline in attendance. Beyond that, it is the opinion of many persons who have observed the 10:30 service that it lacks energy and a segment of the church community that is willing to support it. Eliminating that service would also give greater flexibility in scheduling and planning the Christian Education time (for both children and adults) after the early service which is part of our church's ministry that has seen an increase in numbers and energy in the past year.

A few personal observations (in no particular order) about the proposed change:

- 1) The 10:30 time would still be open for us to do special services on a Sunday morning, such as Blue Christmas, other services of healing, and prayer vigils on an occasional basis.
- 2) If such a change is approved the Salem House Band is still committed to playing once a month, but would do so at the 8:30 a.m. service.
- 3) For persons thinking that this move will substantially affect my work week or will significantly lighten my work load, it won't. It will just shorten Sunday morning by an hour-hour and a half. All of the preparation for liturgy and sermons still has to be done by Saturday afternoon; after that I'm just repeating the same sermon.

Perhaps the 10:30 a.m. service has run its course and we, as a congregation may be led to do other things with time. That, however, is for you, the members of Salem, to decide—as it should be. Let the discussion begin and let God's Spirit move among us in the process.

Makes you think, doesn't it? For some, it may bring to mind St. Paul's words to the Ephesians: "Be careful then how you live," he wrote, "not as unwise people but as wise, making the most of the time . . ." (Ephesians 5:15). Time is indeed quite precious.

A MESSAGE FROM YOUR CONGREGATIONAL PRESIDENT

Topic: Time to Reflect

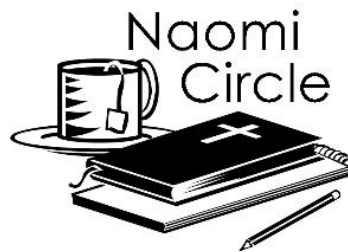

Thank you to all who blessed me with cards and gifts over the holidays. It is always a nice surprise and much appreciated to be remembered.

The start of a new year brings with it new plans and renewed efforts from the Health Ministry to meet your needs. One such effort is the development of a new visitors group. Our first meeting is tentatively planned for January 3rd at 1:00 p.m. Watch for bulletin announcements, or call Pam to check on the meeting status. Anyone interested is encouraged to attend.

The other, is a renewed effort to offer a cancer support group. My plans are to alternate a monthly weekday morning group with a monthly Saturday morning group for those not able to make a weekday meeting. Starting the last Saturday in January, there will be a cancer support group meeting at 10:00 a.m. This group will meet again the last Saturday in March, May, July, September and November. The weekday group will meet the last Wednesday morning at 10:00 a.m. in February, April, June, August, October and December. These plans are tentative so, again, watch for postings. I ask that those planning to attend, **please sign-up** so I know how many will be coming; the sign-up sheet will be on the sign-up board near the Gathering Area. Also, as things go in Wisconsin during winter, if the weather is poor the meetings will be cancelled.

SPIRITUAL NOURISHMENT

Someone, feeling spiritually unfed, wrote a letter to a newspaper, saying that after some 30 years of attending church, he couldn't remember one sermon. The letter writer said he'd probably wasted his time, and preachers were wasting theirs, as well.

A few days later, someone else wrote a rebuttal. This writer said he'd been married for 30 years but couldn't recall the entire menu of any one of the thousands of meals his wife had fixed. Yet, he knew those meals were nourishing and gave him strength to do his work. He also said that without eating those meals, his body would have been long dead. Without going to worship, he added, he'd be spiritually dead too.
