Now I understand: I'm writing for the September newsletter and wondering where the bulk of summer went. I recognize that it has been a summer full of activity at church and at home, but still the speed at which it has flown on by amazes me. The program year will soon be upon us.

As a number of you already know, the month of September will usher in a change in our worship schedule. Starting September 4, we will be having one service of worship at 10:00 a.m. The Consistory and the Worship Team felt it was best that we focus our energies on celebrating one service of worship and becoming one congregation. No one time will suit everybody's preferences, but we felt it was the best option available. Beginning September 11th, learning opportunities for all ages will start at 9:00 a.m and will run through 9:45 a.m. (more specifics on that, later).

The start of a new program year is worthy of a celebration, and that is what we have planned for Sunday, September 11. Following worship at 10:00 a.m., we will be holding a a picnic-style lunch, giving us the chance to break bread and share fellowship—things we've not been able to do much of in this past two-and-a-half years. There is no cost to attend the lunch; a freewill offering will be received. We begin this time for more optimism and more possibilities than we did in either 2020 and 2021 and for that I am grateful. There is indeed much to celebrate.

Volunteers needed to join conversation on ministry for older adults

The Wisconsin UCC Conference is forming a working group to discuss ministry to older adults. The working group will build on a workshop called "Aging in Trying Times: Isolation and its Mental Health Challenges," that was offered during the Conference Annual Meeting in June.

Jan Aerie, a family counselor and gerontologist, will facilitate the group using an "innovative conversations" model designed to address emerging needs. The working group will address issues important to older adults in the church and community. The group will identify a goal that the Wisconsin Conference and congregations can implement in the year ahead. Monthly meetings will be held on Zoom for one year.



Any UCC member from across the state is welcome to be part of this conversation. If this is an area that interests you, contact the church office and we can put you in touch with Conference staff who are leading this effort.
