New Year's Eve traditions have certainly evolved in our household as the years have marched on. In the early years of our marriage, we would go out to dinner and then to a gathering at Abby's family and see in the new year there. As we've gotten older, we've had dinner at home (some form of "surf and turf") and have seen the new year in while sitting in our living room, in front of the fire, listening to the sounds of Guy Lombardo (once dubbed "The sweetest music this side of heaven"). Shortly after midnight, we'll call up the house where Abby's family has gathered and wish those present greetings for the new year.

Before heading off to bed, we will sit by the fire and wonder what transitions the year ahead might bring. Staring at a blank slate, it is often hard to imagine what might transpire in the twelve months ahead. For example, we had no idea, standing at the threshold of 2020, what disruption and societal turmoil would be unleashed with the spread of COVID-19. Standing at the threshold of 2021, we didn't know that both of Abby's parents would die within three months of each other during that year. Last year, we looked at the start of 2023 knowing full well that my father would soon be making that transition from death into life eternal.

Some events—for good or for bad—we can anticipate; others we can't. As they say, there are no guarantees in this life, just percentages and actuarial tables. Perhaps we should take the words of the Psalmist to heart as we stand at the threshold of the new year: "So teach us to count our days that we may gain a wise heart." (Psalm 90:12 NRSV)

It is my hope the year ahead may bring its share of blessings to you and that in all cirumstances we may treasure and appreciate the time given to us and make wise use of it.


