



First Notes

Although I view the purpose of the Chapel Chime's front page as focusing on future events in the life of the congregation, I do want to start out this month's edition by lifting up something that happened the previous month: the "Night to Shine" event that was jointly held at Salem and Christian Life Assembly of God back on February 9th. It was a good night for the participants, and I was impressed that more people were involved in volunteering for the event than we had the previous year. I am deeply grateful for all of the members of our congregation who were part of the effort: your work, as well as the congregation's willingness to open its space for the event, speaks well to your witness of faith. As a pastor, I was proud of your efforts.

Now, for the matters that lie ahead: the rest of Lent and the approach of Holy Week. It is one of those rare years where all of Holy Week lies in the month March (just barely). As we journey through these last days of the Lenten season, I am reminded that we have spent quite a bit of time in this season using gospel passages from Mark's gospel (along with some readings from John's gospel). In the other years of the Lectionary we will use passages from Matthew and Luke's gospels, but this year we focus on Mark. Now, one of the themes we encounter in Mark's gospel is that Jesus does not want his identity as the Messiah to be revealed until after he has raised from the dead.

That sounds like an odd thing to do. After all, wouldn't Jesus want more people to know who he was?

The more I've thought about the matter, the more it does make sense to me. A good number of people in those days—including the disciples of Jesus, themselves—believed that the Messiah would come to establish an earthly kingdom and right all of the political wrongs done by the Romans and others in power. Jesus had something else in mind, entirely. He would empty himself of power, suffer unimaginable humiliation and pain, and die a slave's death. No one expected that. It would not be until after the resurrection that the whole story would make sense. Easter had to happen first.

The resurrection becomes the lens that makes the sufferings of Jesus make sense. It also becomes the lens that makes our suffering and struggles in this life—especially on behalf on behalf of the gospel—make sense, as well. Easter reminds us that God can redeem the worst of circumstances and create a new thing in the face of death. That message becomes increasingly valuable the longer we've been on this life's journey.

May the re-telling of the story of Jesus' passion, death, and resurrection in this season bring you peace and hope in this season.

OBITUARY "The Bread of Life" March 7, 1965 - January 28, 2024

Almost sixty years ago Rev. Ferguson - 'Fergie' - had an idea to have Salem's Sunday service broadcast on what was then WPLY. A change in ownership of the radio station and program format resulted in a new call sign, WJUB, Jubilation Ministry. That call sign and format changed again a few years ago. Now it's WXGI, and known as Cow Country.

"The Bread of Life" aired for the first time on WPLY on March 7th 1965. Many years passed since that first broadcast happened live via a dedicated phone line. At 9 AM the engineer at the station would open the line between Salem and the radio station, and the head usher had to make certain that the switch in the sound room [close to where the office door now is] was also turned on. Listeners heard the service from that point until 9:30 when the circuit was closed. Rev. Ferguson relied on his wristwatch to pace the service so listeners would hear a hymn, the Scriptures, special music, the Sermon and another hymn. Usually this worked, but not always.

In later years the cost of the dedicated phone line between the church and station became too expensive. The service was then taped and aired one week later. Advances in recording technology changed and taped services gave way to the digital age when we began making the recordings on CDs. After airing, those CDs were archived in the church office.

On January 24, 2024, Salem received a letter from the management of WXGI informing us that January 28, 2024, would be the last day "The Bread of Life" would be aired. That day was five weeks short of 59 years. After 2,977 sermons "The Bread Life" was off the air. Salem had no chance to "plead it's case" to be on the air until March 7, 2024, to fill out the 59 years. Despite this "oversight" almost 59 years is a long time for any radio program to still be on the air. Over the years there were some financial struggles but "The Bread of Life" continued, sustained by the generosity of Salem members who honored an individual or event, or in memory of a loved one. To all of you who supported the radio broadcast ministry a most sincere "thank you."

"The Bread of Life" is survived by evolving technology, airing on Community Cable TV Channel 14, Facebook Live Streaming, DVDs shared with care facilities and in the memories of many listeners over the years.
